

Evan Van Zeumeren is a self-taught macro photographer based near Georgetown, Ontario with a love for insects. He's dedicated the last four years perfecting his craft and using his knowledge of insects and photography to promote how much we need these creatures for our world to thrive. To show that they aren't pests, but a beautiful, crucial part in the circle of life. With subjects this small, this is no easy task. In his presentation Evan will showcase the insects he's found over the years, whilst teaching all the tips and tricks of macro photography he's learned along his journey into the world beneath our feet. He will do a live demonstration and photograph a

specimen to show how to use the equipment (camera, lens, flash), the technique (photo stacking) and the software to achieve extreme close-ups and details for such minute subjects.

The use of still images and video clips help create interest and pull the viewer into the story. Adding sound such as music, special effects and voice-over takes the medium a step further. The Architecture of Toronto, Chicago, NYCPresenter: **Angie McMonigal**www.angiemcmonigal.com

Angie McMonigal is a fine art and commercial architecture photographer based in Chicago. An award-winning fine art photographer, Angie's work has been internationally exhibited and published. Her photos have been showcased by galleries in Chicago, Los

Angeles, New York, Barcelona and other destinations. Focusing more frequently on bold architectural details rather than sweeping cityscapes, her photographs celebrate those unexpectedly iconic elements hiding in plain sight. From landmark buildings she distills the essential lines and textures that frame the city. Angie sees these structures as actively shaping, and shaped by, human activity; they are never mere backdrop. Angie discusses techniques for creating more dynamic architectural images focused on details and abstract interpretations. She'll share examples of 2 locations in each of the following cities: Toronto, Chicago, & New York City.

Mark Zelinski was trained as an artist and a designer. His diverse career as a professional photographer has taken him across 80 countries. He is also a publisher, writer, painter, filmmaker, Fellow of Royal Canadian Geographic Society, member of The Explorer's

Club, Board Member of UNESCO Niagara Escarpment Biosphere Network and winner of the Canadian Governor General's Medal. Mark's presentation of "Niagara Escarpment: Land Between Waters" brings exquisite focus to the environmental treasures of the Niagara Escarpment UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve, and to the diverse Indigenous and modern communities that thrive along its rugged, curving path. The show includes photos and stories from his global travels, and also features stunning photography of Royal Botanical Gardens, considered the plant and wildlife biodiversity hotspot of Canada, and an internationally respected Canadian cultural, education, scientific and tourism organization.

When viewing the prints of award-winning Australian photographer Peter Hill for the first time, many people make the mistake of assuming that their drama, mood, and impact must have been created via Photoshop or some other means of computer-generated manipulation. Not so. Praised for his "real photography" Peter Hill eschews artificial creations of idealistic and over-saturated landscapes, instead preferring to rely on his skills acquired over many years with camera and lens to capture his photographs. This presentation will be focused on photographic issues associated with: Scapes (Landscapes, Cityscapes, Seascapes, Waterscapes, Cloudscapes). Through many examples Peter will answer questions such as: what challenges does each scape represent to the photographer? What makes a 'good' scape photograph? People in scapes – good or bad? Do particular scapes require specific gear?

Tony Sweet is a multi-talented artist. After a successful career as a musician Tony settled on photography as his chosen means of personal expression. He is a Nikon Legend Behind the Lens and overall accomplished photographer. He maintains an active speaking schedule on photography, conducts seminars and publishes his photography worldwide as well as authoring five books on the art of photography. The presentation will discuss Minimalism. Minimalism in photography is a hot topic where style is characterized by simplicity, where the aim is to capture subjects with a minimalist approach, often emphasizing clean lines, uncluttered compositions, and a sense of space or emptiness. It focuses on conveying the essence of the subject by eliminating any unnecessary elements, leading to contemplative and Zen-like quietness.

Mark Hemmings is a professional photographer who began his career in the late 1990's working on feature films in the movie industry. His work broadened to include international travel photography in Asia and Eastern Europe. In 2004 he became a photography workshop instructor, teaching people how to create better photographs and his current workshops include Italy, Japan, Mexico, Spain, the Caribbean and Belize. Mark is also an author of 2 books on mobile phone photography. They say the best camera is the one you have with you. We always have our mobile phones with us and there are times when a larger camera is either impractical or a security risk, and a mobile camera allows us to keep photographing and never miss a shot. Mark's presentation has both technical and aesthetic tips and techniques for using a mobile device camera to create stunning travel photographs.



In the Footsteps of the Group of Seven and Tom ThomsonPresenters: **Sue and Jim Waddington**

Sue is a retired nurse and artist, and Jim is a retired physics professor from McMaster University who likes maps and the sport of orienteering. They live in Hamilton. For almost five decades, Sue and Jim have searched for places that

inspired the Group of Seven painters and Tom Thomson. They especially enjoy locating sites that can only be reached by canoe and foot. The talk will compare photographs of some of the 800 painting sites they have found with the corresponding original artwork from Killarney, Algonquin, Neys, Lake Superior and Bon Echo Provincial Parks, the Georgian Bay Islands, Nova Scotia, BC, the Yukon and Nunavut. They will discuss how they find the painting sites and what they have learned about the painters and their art. They have published a book titled "In the Footsteps of the Group of Seven" to share their experience and highlight the importance of the Group of Seven in Canadian art.
